# MEETING OF SHICIAL GROUP ON THE FUTURE TASKS OF THE ALLIANCE, 22ND NOVEMBER, 1967

#### You may wish to say:

"At the meeting on 8th November, I was asked by the Special Group to submit a draft report to serve as a basis for discussion of the report to Ministers on the Future Tasks of the Alliance.

In response to this request, I circulated on 16th November a FO (FO/67/832) which contains my suggested draft for this report. Since we have already had an exchange of declarations by Governments at our last meeting, I believe that we could now proceed directly to examine the draft before you, and see whether, from this examination, we can agree on the general ideas set out in this text. I trust that in this way we can move forward. For after this analysis we ought to try to arrive at a decision on the final make-up and formulations of the document to be presented to Ministers. In fact it is my hope that we can arrive at such a decision on the main lines of a common policy as quickly as possible, maybe even today. At that point we might also discuss exactly what activity of the Alliance we envisage for the period after the Christmas recess."
